Meeting Summary: K. Baker introduced Mae Williams, grant consultant and architectural historian and turned the meeting over to her. M. Williams gave an informative powerpoint presentation and answered questions about the NH Division of Historical Resources (NHDHR) grant to develop a model survey process for identifying areas of historic and cultural resources. The National Park Service (NPS) awarded the NHDHR funds from the federal *Storm Recovery and Disaster Planning Grant Program*. The goal is a model process that will be useful to New Hampshire towns for planning and hazard mitigation purposes, and help increase community awareness of these resources. Center Harbor is serving as the case study town for the grant. Members of the community are being asked to help identify Town historical and cultural resources that they believe are important. The resources will be mapped and may be added as an overlay to the current GIS Town map. Most of this work will take place during Spring 2017, when additional community meetings will be scheduled.
